The roles will provide counselling to clients who need support with bereavement, life-changing illness or significant loss. You will work in partnership with Talking Therapies using their systems and processes to maintain appropriate client records and utilise assessment forms and service evaluations with all clients to evidence positive therapeutic movement. You will also be required to proactively manage your own diary and caseload and provide ad hoc counselling administration support in the event of DNAs/ cancellations/ reservations.

The roles requires great flexibility, time management and communication skills. The successful applicants also require self-motivation and the ability to manage their own workload.
